

What are “Non-Traditional Instructional Days”?

The last couple of winters have brought us unusual inclement weather, which resulted in excessive school closings. In response to this, we were granted the option to implement a Non-Traditional Instructional Day Program from KY Department of Education. This will allow us to utilize some non-traditional methods to continue with learning on days that would otherwise be lost due to the weather. Below you will find a roadmap to requirements needed to fulfill our obligation to KDE and answer some possible questions you might have regarding the program.



Remember this is a new program and we will continue to look for ways to be more efficient. Implementation is always difficult at the beginning of any new program. But, this will enable learning to continue when it is necessary to miss multiple days of schools due to inclement weather or other emergencies.

Information for “Non-Traditional Instructional Days”

- The Superintendent will determine which days will be designated as a “Non-Traditional Instructional Day”.



- Principals and Teachers will be able to tailor delivery methods based on class / student needs

- Google Classroom can be accessed for teachers that prefer an online option

- Hard copies of academic work may be provided in advance



- “Non-Traditional Instructional Days” will only be implemented in rare situations when school must be closed but our area still has access to electricity
Ex: Inclement weather, water outages or other issues



- “Non-Traditional Instructional Days” will be communicated through District / School Webpages, Facebook, Twitter, various media outlets, ONE CALL system, etc.

- Principals and Teachers will discuss the process with students in detail before this is implemented. Students will be required to complete all assignments as outlined by their teacher and returned within 5 days when school resumes.
- Teachers will be available through the use of Google Classroom (if they choose this option), their class webpages, email, Remind 101, etc. The means of communication can vary between teachers and buildings.
- Faculty / Staff will be required to report to school at regular time. Building administrators at each school will be responsible for setting schedule for the day.
