<u>Russell Primary School</u> (From the desk of Mrs. Crager)



Mrs. Wilburn showed us "There is a New Sheriff in Town" Visit from local Law Enforcement.




• Electricity-not getting their wires crossed and keeping us energized at RATC. Mr. Springer finishes up his first year working at RATC
